On this day came on to be heard the application of Mrs Sarah E. Patterson, filed herein on April 9, 1906, for the probate of the will of J. M. Patterson, deceased, and it appearing to the court that citations and notice of such application have been served and returned in the manner and for the length of time required by law, testimony was heard on said application.

It appearing from the ^{written} testimony of C. C. Middleton, and J. C. Putz, two of the subscribing witnesses thereto, that the instrument filed with said application, dated Dec. 16, 1905, was signed by the testator J. M. Patterson, in their presence, and in the presence of W. A. Kemp, the other attesting witness, on said Dec 16, 1905; and that they were ~~satisfied~~ ^{sworn} upon by testator to witness same as his last will and testament. That at the time of executing said will testator was over the age of twenty-one ^{years} and was of sound mind; that said testator J. M. Patterson died on March 13, 1906, in Dallas County, Texas at his residence and where his estate is situated; that said will has not been revoked by testator, it is the opinion of the court that said will shall be admitted to probate, as the last will and testament of J. M. Patterson dec'd, and it is ordered that said will together with said testimony is ordered of record.

It further appearing that Sarah E. Patterson is named in said will as executrix without bond, it is ordered that she be in all things confirmed as such independent executrix and that letters testamentary be issued to her by the clerk on her taking the oath prescribed by law.

It is further ordered that G. B. Gilispie, C. C. Middleton, and Randolph Paris be and they are hereby appointed as appraisers of said estate.
