The Petition of Mrs.

Dorothea Nussbaum, widow of  
 Jacob Nussbaum, residing in Dal-  
 las County & State of Texas, respect-  
 fully represents that her said  
 husband Jacob Nussbaum,  
 a late resident of Dallas County,  
 departed this life on the 12 day  
 of December 1881, in said County,  
 leaving a written Will, which  
 is heret annexed whereby said  
 Testator <sup>gave, devised & bequeathed</sup> ~~disposed~~ of all his real  
 personal & mixed property of which  
 he did possessed of to your  
 Petitioner; that all of said  
 property so devised & bequeathed  
 is in Dallas County, Texas <sup>and</sup>  
 of the probable value of twenty five  
 thousand Dollars

That said Testator  
 in said Will, nominated and  
 appointed your Petitioner Executor

thereof and dispensed her  
 from giving any Bond or to  
 take any further action in the  
 Administration of said Estate  
 except to prove & record said  
 Will.

That your Petitioner  
 is not disqualified by law  
 from acting as Executor of  
 said Will.

Wherefore your Petitioner  
 respectfully prays that citation  
 may issue according to law and  
 that after due proof that  
 said Will be admitted to  
 probate according to law, as  
 the last Will & Testament

Jacob. Nussbamer, of the County of  
Dallas and State of Texas, being in good  
health and of sound and disposing  
mind and memory do make and publish  
this my last will and testament  
 hereby revoking all former wills  
by me at any time heretofore made,  
First, I direct that all of my  
just debts shall be paid.

Second, To my beloved wife  
Dorothea Nussbamer I give,  
devise and bequeath all of my  
estate real, personal and mixed  
of which I shall die seized and  
possessed, or to which I shall  
be entitled at the time of my decease.

Third, I nominate and appoint  
my beloved wife the said Dorothea,  
to be executrix of this will and  
direct that no security shall be  
required of her as such.

Fourth, I direct that no other action  
be had in the County Court, in the  
administration of my estate than to  
prove and record this will.

A. D. 1878, in the presence of R. D.  
Coughanour and F. M. Coekrell who  
attest the same at my request.
