To the honorable County Court of said County.

Your petitioner Minnie Mitchell respectfully represents that she is a resident citizen of the County of Dallas, State of Texas and has lived in said county for many years. That she is a single woman and of age.

That she has now in her possession and has had since the 17th day of May, 1900, an infant that was then born, when its mother died.

That said child was born out of lawful wedlock, and that the father thereof is not known to your petitioner nor to the father and mother of its mother.

That its mother Lily Jones was being attended by her mother at the time of her death, and after her death the said child was left in the care, custody, and keeping of your petitioner for adoption.

That the parents of Lily Jones have always recognized, since the birth of said child and the death of its mother, the wishes of your petitioner and have ratified your petitioner's adoption of said child by written relinquishment hereto attached and made a part of this petition, in which they surrender all their rights and claims to said child, requesting your petitioner to adopt the same, and requesting this Honorable Court to appoint your petitioner as its guardian.

That said child is a girl ^{known by the name of Allie Victoria} without estate and without any claim of any one upon her for adoption. That your petitioner has at all times since the birth of said child treated it as her own and devotes to it motherly care and attention.

That there are no other parties who claim said child or are dubious of having it so far as she is informed and believes.

Wherefore the premises considered your petitioner prays that citation issue herein in terms of the law and on hearing hereof she be appointed guardian of the person of said child. *Minnie Mitchell*

This Agreement entered into by and between Mrs. Raney Jones and her husband _____ Jones of Washington, County of Hemstead, State of Arkansas parties of the first part, and Miss Minnie Mitchell of the city and County of Dallas, State of Texas party of the second part witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part are the father and mother respectively of Lily Jones now deceased. That the said Lily Jones died in the city and County of Dallas, State of Texas on the 17th day of May, 1900, leaving surviving her one child, a girl now in the possession of the said party of the second part. That the said party of the second part has had possession of said child since said time; has become as much attached to it as if it were her own and wishes to adopt it. That said child was born out of lawful wedlock and it is not known by said parties of the first part who is the father of it. Wherefore in consideration of the promises and further in consideration of the care, kindness and attention that the said party of the second part has manifested toward said child and her desire to adopt it, _____ we said parties of the first part do hereby renounce and relinquish each and every claim that we have to said child in favor of the said party of the second part, and do hereby request said party of the second part to adopt said child as her own and to take all lawful means and ways for the adoption of the same. Witness our hand this 10th day of November, 1900.
