TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COUNTY:

Your petitioner Sarah Catherine Barnes respectfully shows to
the Court:

(1)

That she is the surviving widow of William Barnes deceased,
and that said William Barnes died on the 30th day of October 1899
in the City and County of Dallas.

(2)

That he left surviving him your petitioner, his widow and
their three children, Hugh A. Barnes a son age thirteen years,
Cecil A. Barnes a daughter age ten years and Mary B. Barnes a ~~daughter~~
daughter age four years all of whom reside in the city of Dallas
with your petitioner.

(3)

That there is community estate between deceased William Barnes
and your petitioner, consisting of a small amount of household and
kitchen furniture of very small value and about forty-five and one
half acres of land in Johnson County of the probable value of ~~seven~~
hundred dollars and three city lots in Dallas County, the same
being conveyed on the 4th of June 1893 by J.C. Gilliland to William
Barnes by deed duly recorded in said County in Volume 76 page 360
records of Johnson County, the consideration of which said deed was
a promissory note for one hundred and thirty dollars and thirty-
nine cents payable on or before November 10th 1893 ~~now~~ at the rate
of ten per cent per annum and the assumption by William Barnes of a
note executed by H.C. Gilliland to the County treasurer of Johnson
(1)

County, for one hundred and eighty-two dollars, which said indebtedness is still unpaid, and three lots situated in the County of Dallas, Texas, known and designated as lots 33 in block "R" lot 3 in block "Q" and lot 10 in block "W" of Webster and Wood's North Park addition to the City of Dallas, of little or no value.

Said deceased William Barnes died intestate in Dallas County as aforesaid without any other estate save his interest in said community estate; and your petitioner is not in any manner disqualified from controlling, managing and disposing of said community property according to law in such cases provided.

(5)

Your petitioner prays for the appointment of appraisers to appraise said estate and that he be authorized to give bond as survivor and for an order of court that she be given the right to manage and dispose of said community property in such manner as may seem best for the interest of said estate and for the payment of the debts against same, in accordance with title 39 chapter 28 of the revised statutes of the State of Texas, all of which she is ready to verify.
