sickness

The intention of this will  
is to bequeath all property  
I may possess to said  
W. L. Shuffette at my death  
after expenses of last sickness  
& burial expenses shall have  
been paid out of said prop-  
erty

Now it is my will that  
no action be had in the  
probate Court except to probate  
this will & to return me in  
possession of property as bequeathed  
& that no bond be required  
of my executor & I hereby  
nominate & appoint William  
Chapman as my executor  
of this will. W. L. Shuffette
