Now comes John Percy the
father of M. C. Alarage and grand
father of Hannah E & Ed & kids in
1853 and protesting against the
grant of letters of Guardianship
of said Minors to the said Newton
Alarage & represents that said Al-
arage is in no way related to said
children or left by said father that
said mother is dead and that
said Alarage is wholly unfit for
the duties of Guardianship to said Mi-
nors that he has no wife no fixed
place of residence that he is in
the habit of getting drunk and
using profane language and
that he has not the necessary means
or property to feed & clothe & care
for said Minors in the way and
manner the same ought to be done
The said Percy represents that he is
old and infirm and can take
care of said Minors and prays
your Honour to refuse to con-
sider to refuse the application
of said Alarage and grant him
petition in the premises subject of
said Minors

Whereas John Rudy, Guardian
of Hannah G. & S. Kidd, in the Probate Court in
and for the County of Dallas & State aforesaid
on the 31st day of January A.D. 1866 against
Newton Aldridge for the sum of Five Dollars—
besides Costs of suit, from which decision the
said Newton Aldridge, has appealed to our District
Court, Now therefore we Robert ^{for} Worthington and
Lewis ^{for} Hester, do bind and as Sureties, acknowledge
ourselves bound to pay to J. M. Patterson Chief
Justice of Dallas County, Texas the sum of
Five Dollars conditioned that the said Newton
Aldridge shall prosecute his Appeal with effect,
and perform the Sentence, judgement or decree
of the District Court in case the decision of
said Court shall be against the appellant,
Witness our hands this 18th day of February A.D.
1866.

Know all men by these presents, THAT *John Reedy* as principal, and *R. R. Fletcher* and *John M. Laws* as sureties, are held and firmly bound unto the Chief Justice of the county of Dallas, in the sum of *Two Hundred* — dollars, for the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we hereby bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents, signed and sealed with our seals, the seals being scrawls, this *18th* day of *February* A. D. 18*60*.

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION is such, that, whereas, the above bounden *John Reedy* has been appointed *Guardian of the Persons of Hannah & E. L. Kidd, Minor Heirs of*

Now, if the said *John Reedy* shall well and truly perform all the duties required of *him* by law, under said appointment, then this obligation shall be null and void; otherwise, to be and remain in full force and effect.

Your petition, Newton Aldridge, of
 Dallas County, Texas, was filed in my

 Sarah Aldridge, deposed that she left two
 children, female, named Hannah C. & E. S. W. Little
 aged about 18 years, while his said wife had be-
 fore she married your petitioner; that said child-
 ren have no other of any kind whatever. Your
 petitioner therefore prays that he may be ap-
 pointed the guardian of the persons of said Han-
 nah C. & E. S. W. Little, and he will ever
 pray etc.
