Know all men by these presents, that I, Max Biederstaedt of the County of Dallas and State of Texas being in good health and of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all my former wills by me at any time heretofore made.-

First.- I direct that all my just debts and funeral charges shall be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as shall be found convenient.

Second.- I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Regina Biederstaedt all my estate both real and personal of which I shall die possessed.

Third.- I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Regina Biederstaedt sole executrix of this my will.

Fourth.- It is my will that no other action shall be had in the County Court in the administration of my estate, than to prove and record this will and to return all Inventory and appraisement of my estate.

Fifth.- I direct that no security shall be required of my wife Regina Biederstaedt as Executrix.

 of Dallas County:

YOUR PETITIONER, of Dallas, Texas, would respectfully show to the Court that Max Biederstaedt is dead; that he died on or about the 29<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1904, at Dallas, in the State of Texas; that said deceased at the time of his death was a resident of the County of Dallas in the State of Texas.

That he left estate in Dallas County consisting of the family homestead property; that the nature and probable value of said estate are as follows, to-wit:

one house, a one-story frame cottage, known as 176 Andover Street in Dallas, Texas, and some personal property the nature and amount of which is not at this time ascertainable; that there are no debts owing by said estate other than a balance of purchase money on the homestead and this will be paid by executor, and no necessity exists for an administration or the issuance of letters testamentary.

The probable value of the entire estate including the homestead is Fifteen Hundred Dollars, all of which is, under the law, exempt from debts of deceased, if any exist.

That deceased left a written Will, bearing date 12<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1904, in the

form of among his personal effects which your petitioner believes and therefore alleges to be the Last Will and Testament of said deceased, and which is herewith filed, marked Exhibit "A," and made a part hereof; that

Regina Biederstaedt, the person named in said Will as executor thereof, resides at Dallas, Texas,

and is the wife of deceased.

That said will provides that no action be had by this court further than to prove and record this will & return an amount of appraisement.

Wherefore, petitioner prays that citation issue herein, as the law provides, and that upon a hearing and the proofs adduced said Will be admitted to probate, and the app't of appraisement, and that all other necessary and proper orders be made in the premises.
