Item 1<sup>d</sup>, I desire and direct, that my body be  
buried in a decent manner and Christian like  
manner, suitable to my circumstances and con-  
dition in life.

Item 2<sup>d</sup>, I desire and direct, that my just debts  
be paid without delay by my executors to be here-  
after appointed.

Item 3<sup>d</sup>, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife  
Nancy A Lagow a certain tract of land the same  
being my homestead and consisting of two hundred acres  
of land, be the same more or less, lying in Dallas County  
and a part of the Thomas Beeman League and Labor  
Survey, Beginning at the S.W. corner of the John Beeman  
640 acre tract on said League Survey, running thence  
S 42 $\frac{1}{2}$  W to the centre of a small branch, thence  
up said branch with its meanders to the North line  
of the right of way on the Texas & Pacific Railroad  
thence with said right of way in a westerly direction  
to the N E line of the 640 acre tract, thence  
N 45 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. to the Dallas & Gaines Bridge road as  
now located, thence east with said road to the  
West line of said Beeman tract, thence south with  
said line to the beginning, to be used by her and  
her children, during her natural life with  
all the improvements and every thing pertaining thereto  
for her and their benefit. I also give and bequeath  
to my beloved wife in the same unreserved manner  
Two mules, one Mare and Colt, Eight Cows &  
Calves, to be selected by her out of my stock.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> It is my wish and desire that my executors  
to be hereafter named, have and take possession of  
any money or monies that I may have in the  
American National Bank in the City of Dallas

the use & benefit of my wife & her children;

Item 5<sup>th</sup>

It is my desire that the remainder <sup>of my estate</sup>, both  
real and personal, wherever, and whatever it  
may be, including that given to my beloved wife  
Nancy A, during her natural life <sup>her</sup> after estate  
thereon is over, I give, bequeath and demise to  
my children, William Richard, Luella Matellar  
Lydia Victoria, Martin Luther, Mary Caroline  
Daniel Michison, Luella Ann, Charles Emery  
and Minnie Elizabeth, equally, share and share  
alike, and when it becomes necessary, in the  
opinion of my executors to have my estate  
partitioned among <sup>my</sup> children as set forth above,  
it is my desire that the then acting County  
Judge of Dallas County, appoint three discreet  
and disinterested persons to make partition of  
the same, without any further costs, than that  
of making the same, to be done without suit  
in any Court except as specified herein

Item 6<sup>th</sup>

I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved  
wife Nancy A. Lagow and my son William  
Richard Lagow, sole executors of this my  
last will and testament, and it is my desire  
that they do not be required <sup>to give</sup> any bond in  
their capacity as such executors.


